

# What is School Choice?

School choice is about empowering families to choose the best educational opportunity for their child, whether that's public school, private school, charter school, or homeschool.

Beyond just the freedom to choose that opportunity, school choice programs are designed to help families overcome the financial and regulatory barriers they may face when attempting to enroll their child in a school other than the child's assigned public school. We classify those programs into three main types:




### **Private School Choice**

Private school choice programs, like ESAs, vouchers, and tax credits, offer parents the ability to use government funding to offset the cost of private school tuition. ESAs and tax credits also allow parents to use those funds for additional expenses like educational therapies, tutoring, transportation, and more.



### **Public School Choice**

Sometimes referred to as "Portability" or "Open Enrollment," public school choice would allow a student to more easily transfer to a different public school within their district (intradistrict) or to a different public school outside of their district (interdistrict).



## **Charter Schools**


Charter schools are public schools. They are tuition-free, open to all students, and funded by taxpayers — just like traditional public schools. However, charter schools operate independently from local school districts, which gives them more flexibility to innovate and focus on what works best for their students.
